ANOTHER YEAR PASSES OFF

The year 2017 is also now a part of history. A quick review of the happenings during the year, in the perspective of the BSNL pensioners, would confirm that most part of the year was engaged in getting the pension of those pensioners, who retired prior to 10.06.2013, revised by allowing the benefit of merger of 50% DA with Basic Pay effectively amounting to 78.2% for the purpose of fitment. At least in respect of the retired executives, this was not a smooth affair since the executives, who retired between 1.1.2007 and 9.6.2013, were first required to be granted notional increment @ 3% of their existing basic pay for fixation of pay on promotions/upgradations they got after 1.1.2007. Thereafter, their pension was to be revised. We may recall that it is only AIBSNLREA which took up this issue with BSNL Management to ensure that notional increment @ 3% of the existing basic pay on promotion is granted to these retired executives before revision of their pension. As usual, we found the Principal CCAs/CCAs to be most ill-equipped and unprepared to deal with the cases. In fact, even now there are some cases where these offices are on the wrong side of the rules governing pension fixation/revision. Had our Branches not followed up the cases with BSNL Units and the Principal CCAs/CCAs, the situation would have been further worse. DOT, on its part, also had to monitor the progress and issue time to time advice.

Even though implementation of DOT Order dated 18/07/2016 for pension revision with fitment benefit of 78.2% is by and large getting completed, the issue is far from over. The order itself is defective since it ordered pay/pension revision on 'notional' basis. We have challenged this Order along with the DOT Order dated 10/06/2013 in which the fitment benefit of 78.2% was allowed with effect from 10.06.2013 but disallowing arrears. Our Writ Petition in Supreme Court is expected to come up before the Court for admission in January 2018. This will certainly be an important day for us. Till then we are keeping our fingers crossed.

Following issue of Order by Department of Public Enterprises accepting the recommendations of 3rd Pay Revision Committee on revision of IDA pay scales and allowances for the CPSE Executives, all attention was concentrated on BSNL's reaction and action. After all, BSNL is not a profit making CPSE – though during the last few years it is having operating profit and the 'affordability' clause to consider pay revision has put BSNL in a disadvantageous position. But BSNL found a way to recommend pay revision of its executives with 15% fitment benefit which was also approved by its Board and then sent to DOT for consideration and final approval. Now DOT has to take a call on this. Meanwhile the Unions/Associations preferred to go on

Strike for two days mainly as a mark of protest instead of trying for a negotiated settlement of the issue of pay revision. This premature action, as feared, has failed to create any impact and accelerate the decision on pay revision. We are still hopeful that the issue will get resolved in the background that the same DOT had allowed revision of pay scales of MTNL Executives with 30% fitment benefit based on 2nd PRC recommendations – even though MTNL was a chronic loss making CPSE for decades and the affordability clause existed then too. We attach importance to pay revision of BSNL Executives, since as per the law of the land laid down by Hon'ble Supreme Court, pension will have to undergo revision when pay scales of the Executives are revised.

DOT also ordered that the higher limit of DCRG etc, as allowed to CG Employees as per recommendation of the 7th CPC, are also applicable to the retired/retiring BSNL employees w.e.f. 1.1.2016. This benefits mostly the Executives and the order extending the benefit to the BSNL employees did not come so easily. Despite the precedence available when the enhanced limit of DCRG was allowed to the BSNL Executives after 6th CPC recommendations and the Rules on the issue being very clear, DOT again preferred to refer the issue to DOP&PW. This Association pursued with the case at every level and finally the matter was resolved. It is also to be recalled that it is AIBSNLREA which pleaded with 7th CPC for not only enhancing the limit of DCRG but also link future enhancement with increase in DA. The 7th CPC accepted both and accordingly the Order was issued by the Government DOT issued an Order to collect, complete and keep safe custody of all pension related

records of IDA pensioners with Principal CCA/CCA. It has also announced that even Service Books would also be in safe custody of the Principal CCA/CCA, for which separate Orders will be issued. We welcomed this decision and requested DOT that all the pension related records including the Service Books of the IDA pensioners, who had all India transfer liability and retired at a station falling within the jurisdiction of a particular Principal CCA/CCA, be transferred to the Principal CCA/CCA Office of the area in which these IDA Pensioners have settled after their retirement. If agreed to, this will resolve a genuine problem of those Executives who settle after retirement at a station which falls under the jurisdiction of Principal CCA/CCA other than the one from which they retire from service.

DOT also issued an Order, according to which, Principal CCA/CCA will pay pension/family pension directly in the Bank Accounts of the pensioners/family pensioners. Now the Banks are doing this function. We have protested against this move, since it will create more problems to the pensioners. The Principal CCAs/CCAs are ill-equipped due to lack of adequate and competent man-power, lack of proper accommodation and no network of offices down below to interact with the aggrieved pensioners. Moreover, issue of Form 16 for TDS and ensuring their timely and accurate distribution will never be possible. Further, the pensioners, especially those living in remote areas, will find it difficult to submit their annual life-certificate. This move, therefore, will create a mess of the system and needs to be resisted.

DOP&T, in pursuance to a Supreme Court judgment, issued an Order for waiver of

recovery of excess/wrongful payment made to the employees in some specific cases. BSNL also circulated this Order and laid down a procedure to process the cases for waiver of recovery. This is welcome development since the affected BSNL employees/retirees can take help of these Orders to get their grievances redressed.

BSNL, on its part, accepted the request to restore the medical claims for outdoor treatment without voucher to the retired BSNL employees. But there is a need to review the existing decision on deciding the limit. A method needs to be evolved to ensure that the past pensioners are not in a disadvantageous position compared to the future pensioners since the IDA as on April

of the year in which, one retires is taken into consideration to calculate the limit.

BSNL issued Orders allowing the benefit of free night calling facility to the BSNL pensioners in their residential telephone connection sanctioned by BSNL. However, initially the STD calls were being charged. But subsequently, on being represented, BSNL issued Orders correcting this position.

Now, we hope that the New Year will bring some meaningful relief to the pensioners/family pensioners. We also pledge to re-dedicate ourselves to strongly present and pursue the cases of the pensioners/family pensioners in general and retired BSNL executives in particular.

INCREASE IN IDA W.E.F. 1.1.2018

According to calculations based on All India Consumer Price Index for Industrial Workers, IDA is to increase w.e.f. 1.1.2018 by 2.6% for CPSEs where last pay revision was implemented w.e.f. 1.1.2007 and by 4.4% where last pay revision was implemented w.e.f. 1.1.1997.
