BSNL CANNOT BE ALLOWED TO PERISH

There is no doubt that, at this point of time, all round health of BSNL is in a very precarious condition. Once a cash rich Company, BSNL is now crying for fund even to run its existing services besides making payment of the salary of its employees and also clear the pending medial claims of both the serving and retired employees. Never before, such an acute critical condition was witnessed. BSNL is a Government run Public Sector Organization and it cannot move a single inch without the nod of the Government in all matters including selection of technology and purchase of equipment to run the services and its further expansion. It has no autonomy of any kind on any issue including HR related matters. It has to seek approval and advice from its administrative Department i.e. Department of Telecommunications on each and everything. But still, when BSNL under performs or faces any sort of crisis, the Administrative Department seems to try maintaining a safe distance and shirk its responsibility. BSNL's need are always sacrificed at the altar of bureaucratic procedure and red-tapism.

The Administrative Department of BSNL i.e. the Department of Telecom, in fact, needs to own almost the entire responsibility of BSNL's present day crisis. It repeatedly did not allow BSNL to order purchase of equipment which was once badly needed to expand its mobile network, which forced BSNL to slip from

the number two position in mobile segment, which it had gained despite being allowed to enter the segment years later – again due to wrong policy of Department of Telecommunication, just over a decade ago. The Administrative Department i.e. DOT again caused immense trouble for BSNL when it did not allow BSNL to take part in the auction for 4-G spectrum and thus, to-day BSNL is paying heavily for its inability to offer high speed data services to the customers and therefore failing in the competition with other Operators. It is again the Administrative Department i.e. DOT which failed to appreciate the immediate future changes in the technology and thus wasted huge money by investing in landline service just before corporatization of its Telecom services which has now become the burden on BSNL.

BSNL has always been used to implement the Government's social obligations and to take services to remote and most difficult areas and run the services – even though these were non-remunerative. It needs to be remembered that after entry of BSNL only, the private operators who were fleecing the customers with exorbitant tariffs, including for incoming calls, were compelled to bring down the prices. Presence of BSNL in the telecom field, as a moderator, is an utmost necessity to keep the services affordable for the common man.

It is true that the Government is now considering certain proposals to bail out BSNL from the present unprecedented crisis. But given the bureaucratic procedures that still prevail in the Government, immediate and positive decisions may not be expected. Therefore, the Administrative Department now needs to infuse required cash flow so that the immediate need of

BSNL to run services is duly taken care of. It is a good omen that BSNL's Annual Gross Revenue for the quarter ending June, 2019 has reported to have been grown by over 27%. Now, the Administrative Department needs to be with BSNL and to encourage it to perform even better. BSNL cannot be allowed to perish at all, keeping in mind that this will be a great National loss.

INCREASE IN IDA W.E.F. 1.10.2019

According to calculations based on All India Consumer Price Index for Industrial Workers, IDA is to increase w.e.f. 1.10.2019 by 5.3% for CPSEs where last pay revision was implemented w.e.f. 1.1.2007 and by 8.9% where last pay revision was implemented w.e.f. 1.1.1997.

OPENING OF PENSIONERS' SERVICE CENTRES THROUGH CPMS PORTAL- AIBSNLREA RAISES THE ISSUE WITH BSNL REGARDING THE PROGRESS MADE: On the advice of DOT, BSNL vide its No. 48-3/2018-Pen (B) dated 05.10.2018, had instructed all its Circles/Units to open Pensioners' Service Centres through Comprehensive Pension Management System (CPMS) portal. These Pensioners' Service Centres are supposed to provide facilities like uploading of digital Life Certification, Downloading Form 16, uploading grievances, assistance in filling pension forms by employees/family pensioners and assistance in installing Mobile App etc. Keeping in view of the importance of these Centres in the background that CPMS has already been implemented for new pensioners and also the old pensioners are to be gradually brought under this system, AIBSNLREA has requested BSNL to inform the progress made in opening these Pensioners' Service Centres in all Circle/Units. Association has also requested to supply a consolidated list of these Pensioners' Service Centres with their locations which are now functional. The Association has further requested to advise the Circles/Units to upload the list of such functional Pensioners' Service Centres in their respective websites. EXTREME HARDSHIP OF THE SENIOR CITIZENS/PENSIONERSA DUE TO DRASTIC CUT IN THE INTEREST RATES OF THE FIXED DEPOSITS WITH BANKS/POST OFFICES- AIBSNLREA URGES PM TO INTERVENE: AIBSNLREA has stated in a letter to Prime Minister of India that "interest rates of Fixed Deposits in Banks/Post Offices have been reduced drastically during the last few years, which has hit the Senior Citizens/Pensioners most. No doubt, the Senior Citizens/Pensioners are allowed 0.50% additional interest, but this hardly compensates the loss in terms of the interests earned". The Association has further submitted that "The interests on Fixed Deposits help the Senior Citizens/ Pensioners to meet their day to day requirement which includes payment of huge medical bills due to old age related and other chronic ailments" and also urged PM to intervene and (i) raise the limit of maximum deposit in Senior Citizens Saving Schemes from existing Rs. 15 lakhs to Rs. 30 lakhs and also (ii) raise

RESPONSE TO AIBSNLREA'S REPRESENTATION

CGHS FACILITIES TO THE RETIRED BSNL/MTNL EMPLOYEES WHO ARE IN RECEIPT OF PENSION FROM CENTRAL CIVIL ESTIMATES– DOT REPLIES TO AIBSNLREA'S REPRESENTATION TO SECRETARY (TELECOM): Being unsatisfied with the reply dated 10.08.2019 that was received from DOT in response to its representation dated 16.07.2019 {view posting dated 17.07.2019}, AIBSNLREA had again addressed a letter dated 14.08.2019 to Secretary (Telecom) (view posting dated 14.08.2019) requesting to consider the request that the Association originally made in its earlier letter dated 16.07.2019 suggesting that on receipt of demand letter for one-time payment from CGHS authority by the BSNL pensioners, let BSNL immediately make arrangement to pay the entire amount as advance to the concerned pensioners who would submit the Receipt issued by the CGHS authorities within a fortnight to the Units which sanctioned them the advance. 19.09.2019 EMERGENCY TREATMENT IN CGHS EMPANELLED HOSPITALS- DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH & FAMILY WELFARE REITERATES THAT REFUSAL OF ADMISSION OF CGHS BENEFICIARIES IN EMERGENCIES ON CREDIT BASIS BY EMPANELLED HOSPITALS WOULD ATTRACT THEIR DISQUALIFICATIONS: Taking note of the fact that some CGHS empaneled Hospitals are denying admission or insist on referral memo from CGHS Wellness Centre even in emergency conditions, Department of Health & Family Welfare has issued an OM vide No. S.11011/29/2019-EHS dated 13.09.2019 stating that in emergency the empaneled hospitals will not refuse admission or demand an advance payment from the CGHS beneficiary or his family members and will provide credit facilities to the patient. BRANCHES IN ACTION

MEETING OF STATE EXECUTIVE BODY OF UP STATE BRANCH: State Executive Body of UP State Branch of AIBSNLREA meeting was held on 25.09.2019 at Utsav Bhawan in Lucknow under the chairmanship of Shri M K Shukla. 23 members attended the meeting. Report of the State Secretary and also the Report of Finance Secretary were approved after some discussions. Discussion also took place on non-payment of medical reimbursement, CGHS facilities, 3rd PRC, pension revision etc. Shri R.K.Sinha Joint Secretary, CHQ also addressed the House. Meeting ended with presentation of Vote of Thanks by the President. This was followed by lunch.

GENERAL BODY MEETING OF AIBSNLREA, SAHARANPUR BRANCH HELD: A General Body Meeting of Saharanpur Branch {UP} was held on 21.09.2019 under the chairmanship of Shri Bal Chander. Branch secretary briefed the members about various issues confronting the BSNL absorbed pensioners viz. Pension revision, non-payment of Medical bills and status of proposed revival plan of BSNL. The branch Secretary also briefed the members of the proposed AIC at Madurai. It was unanimously decided that Shri J S Bajwa, Branch Secretary will represent the Branch at Madurai AIC. The meeting ended with Vote of Thanks to the chair.

AGB OF AIBSNLREA, COIMBATORE BRANCH HELD: The Annual General Body meeting of AIBSNLREA Coimbatore Branch was held on 21.09.2019 under the Presidentship of Shri M.Ponnuswami, Branch President. After Presidential Address by Shri M. Ponnuswami, Shri R. Damodaran, Branch Secretary welcomed the members & guests and presented the Annual Report and it was accepted by the house. Shri J. Ramalingam, Finance Secretary presented the Income and Expenditure statement and it was accepted after clarifying the query raised by Shri Venkatraman, DGM (Retired).

Then Shri S. Ponnuraj, DE (Retired) spoke on the Supreme Court judgment on seniority lists 1 to 17 of SDEs which has now attained finality and explained in detail the background of the seniority issue. He wanted to know the action being taken by the association for implementation of the judgment on consequential benefits. Shri S. Ravi, DGM (Retired) narrated the association activities in TESA. He announced that he will enroll himself as a member of AIBSNLREA.

In his special address Com. R. R. Balasubramanian mentioned that AIBSNLREA is the first BSNL Pensioners' Association started at national level and explained the necessity for an association exclusively for retired BSNL Executives. He commended the functioning of Coimbatore Branch, taking up and settling various issues pertaining to its members. Then he detailed AIBSNLREA's efforts for getting the consequential benefits on revision of seniority lists 1 to 17. He explained the methodology for opting and joining CGHS, in the present situation where BSNL is not able to settle the medical claims and not able to pay the 'without voucher' claims. He also pointed out that BSNL is not able to pay even the one-time fee to be paid to CGHS and said that AIBSNLREA has been taking up the case with concerned authorities.

Then he elaborated our efforts to get legal remedy against DoT orders dated 10.6.2013 and 18.7.2016, denying arrears and treating the fitment as notional for pensioners. He explained the rationale behind our plea challenging the DoT order dated 10.6.2013, which is in violation of DPE orders. To a suggestion that we lost the case in Principal CAT Delhi as we had emphasized on pay arrears, he replied that our challenge was against the two DoT orders and prayer for payment of pay and pension arrears is only a consequence.

On the proposal by some BSNL and MTNL pensioners' associations on conversion of IDA pension to CDA pension as on 1.10.2016 and applying VII CPC fitment and the proposed methodology for revising pension of post 1.10.2016 pensioners, he mentioned that we do not want to join issue with them, although we are aware that these proposals are not logical and will not meet the requirements of law. However, as some of our members are also carried away by the propaganda, it has become necessary to explain our views. He then explained how the concept of pension revision arose and was first recommended by the V CPC, based on a Supreme Court Judgment that there cannot be any disparity in pension between the present and future pensioners. Pension revision always follows pay revision of the serving employees. He also explained as to how the IDA pension to CDA pension formula being proposed by other BSNL pensioners' association is defective with reference to DoP&PW instructions on IDA to CDA conversion. He emphasized that all the stake holders have to concentrate their efforts on pay revision, which is still possible. Then he spoke about the present liquidity crisis faced by BSNL, the factors contributing to the crisis and the revival package being talked of. Finally, he spoke about the arrangements for All India Conference to be held at Madurai on 12th and 13th November 2019 and requested the Coimbatore Branch to bring a good number of delegates. He also answered queries from the members.

Later, four members conveyed their willingness to attend the AIC and it was decided that more members willing to attend the AIC can convey the same latest by 28.09.2019.

Most of the members of the Coimbatore Branch, members of Erode Branch and a few other retirees executives were present in the meeting. Three retired executives joined AIBSNLREA as members in the meeting and another executive announced that he will also become a member. Shri V.S.Ravi, conveyed that he will become a member of Chennai Branch, as he will be shortly shifting residence to Chennai.

Election of new office bearers was held unanimously with Shri M Ponnuswamy as President and Shri R Damodaran as Branch Secretary. The meeting ended with Vote of Thanks presented by Shri J.Ramalingam, Finance Secretary and was followed by lunch.
