ARE PENSIONERS THE NEW FISCAL VILLAINS?

In an interview to ANI, Shri Sanjeev Sanyal, one of the three full time members of Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minister of India (EAC-PM) has raised serious concerns about the reintroduction of old-style generous pension schemes for civil servants, warning that *"such commitments could overwhelm public finances as demographics shift."* Shri Sanyal, who earlier held the post of Principal Economic Advisor to the Finance Minister, has said, *"We are creating liabilities for next generation because most pensions have pay-as-you-go schemes, but if you are creating systems that will be paid out of current revenues, then be very clear that as our demographic turns at the end of this cycle, may be after 25 years, the population or working age will shrink. And you will be loading the shrinking population with the pensions of the previous generation, and they will not be able to pay it."*

He has cautioned young civil servants against expecting long-term pension security under old-style pension schemes. *"Over your working life, you will be taxed for 35 years. But when you reach the front of the queue, there may be no money left to pay you. The arithmetic simply doesn't work,"* he has said.

Shri Sanyal's statement carries significant weight, not only due to his proximity to decision-making circles, but also because it echoes the Terms of Reference of VIII Central Pay Commission - *'unfunded cost of non-*

contributory pension schemes,' reflecting the current direction of government policy.

When Shri Sanyal says, *"You are effectively creating liabilities for the next generation,"* he is not merely discussing fiscal matters. He is redefining how a society should look at its elderly - not as people who built the nation, but as relics to be stored in a museum. The warning continues - as the working-age population shrinks in a few decades, *"you will be loading that shrinking working population with the pensions of the previous generation, and they will not be able to pay it."*

With this narrative, the old are made to stand opposite the young, as if the dignity of retirees must be purchased by sacrificing the futures of our children. It is a clever framing—but a dangerous one.

Shri Sanyal's argument rests on three conjectures: 1. Pensions are paid from current revenues, so promising defined benefits *"creates liabilities for the next generation;"* 2. After about 25 years, India's working-age population will shrink and *"they will not be able to pay"* these pensions and 3. *"In several European countries, retirement ages are being pushed toward 70 or even 75. France today has more people receiving pensions than people working,"* implying that if India expands or restores Old Pension Scheme, we too will face a European-style crisis. Put together, his argument justifies

dismantling or diluting secure, defined-benefit pensions, while promoting market-linked or contribution-based schemes as fiscally responsible. But this picture leaves out three essential facts: who paid, what the state chooses to spend on, and what kind of society we want to be.

The greatest danger in Shri Sanyal's framing is not one sentence; it is the normalisation of insecurity as a virtue, by seeking to erase the lifetime contribution of employees, to silence the real fiscal leakages, to weaponize Europe's crisis without Europe's context and defining 'intergenerational justice' in a one-sided way.

The statement "*You are effectively creating liabilities for the next generation*" ignores that today's pensioners were yesterday's taxpayers and public servants. For decades they contributed to GDP growth, paid direct and indirect taxes, and accepted government pay-structures often below private-sector equivalents. To portray their pensions as a "freebie" is to break the moral contract between the government and its employees.

When pensions are singled out as a looming "*demographic bomb*," it quietly diverts attention from other, often larger, drains on public resources: tax expenditures, tax concession to the corporates, non-performing assets (NPA) of Banks to the extent of 8.90 lakh crore rupees written off in the past five years, and poorly targeted subsidies. The conversation is narrowed - it is not about how to raise and allocate resources fairly, but only about cutting the secure incomes of retirees.

It is true that some European countries have high old-age dependency and are pushing retirement ages up. But they also have far higher per capita incomes, stronger social

insurance systems, and far more generous social transfers to the needy. To wave "*France has more people receiving pensions than working*" as a scarecrow without mentioning India's very different stage of development, is an intellectual sleight of hand, not a logical comparison.

Read intergenerational justice is not just about the tax load on young workers; it is also about the society they inherit—whether it honours its elders, whether institutions keep promises, and whether the government prefers human dignity over short-term fiscal cosmetics.

If we call pensions "unaffordable liabilities," but remain silent about corporate tax concessions, waiver of NPA or low-efficiency subsidies, we are choosing to protect capital and corporate comfort over elder security. The "burden on future generations" is not pensions alone; it is the sum of all our policy priorities today. Demographic change should be an argument for building robust social security, not for dismantling what little security exists.

Pension is deferred wage, not a gift. Each retiree's pension is the continuation of a contract - they accepted lifetime service under government terms, often with restrictions on political activity, business, and mobility, in exchange for security in old age. To label this as a "freebie" or "liability" will be an effort to retrospectively rewrite that contract.

If something must be called a "liability", it should start at the top, not with pensioners. Before cutting small pensions that keep old people barely above poverty, the government must scan tax expenditures, wasteful schemes, and elite subsidies. Intergenerational justice demands that the most powerful and wealthiest bear

proportionally more of the adjustment than retired workers.

If we allow the word “liability” to colonise our public imagination, we will slowly accept that our parents and elders are a cost, not a responsibility. That is the real danger behind Shri Sanyal’s remarks—not just a fiscal argument, but a moral shift. The numbers can always be rebalanced; a society that disowns

its responsibility to its elders will be much harder to repair.

Intergenerational justice is not achieved by weakening the old — it is achieved by strengthening the young. A nation that treats its retired employees as “liabilities” is a nation that has forgotten its own foundations. The Government must choose gratitude over fear, dignity over rhetoric, and fiscal honesty over convenient scapegoats. ☹



Important Developments of the Month

- ❖ According to calculations based on All India Consumer Price Index for Industrial Workers for the months September, October and November 2025, the revised IDA rate due w.e.f. 01.01.2026 is 236.8% [increase by 3.6%] for CPSEs where the last pay revision was implemented w.e.f. 1.1.2007.
- ❖ AIBSNLREA CHQ has issued Notice for holding of the Fourth All India Conference at Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh on 24th and 25th March 2026. Detailed Circular has been already issued separately. [View the Notification](#)
- ❖ AIBSNLREA had been pursuing with Chairman CBDT requesting closure of Notices issued under Section 154 claiming additional tax on leave encashment for leave earned during DoT period in respect of some of the BSNL absorbed pensioners. All the assesses who received notice on this count had duly submitted their reply mentioning about the BSNL letter No.1001-04/2011-12/Taxation/BSNL/LE/176 dated 04.05.2012 and the Income Tax Appellate Tribunal, Mumbai orders in ITA No. 3261/Mum/2018. Although no further action has been taken by the Income Tax authorities, there are instances where the additional tax is recovered wherever the assessee is eligible for refund. Non-closure of the notices continues to be a sword of Damocles hanging over their head with adverse action against them by the IT department at any point of time in the future. After a specific case was submitted to the CBDT, the issue has been resolved in respect of the assessee allowing the claim of the assessee and reducing the demand. All the affected pensioners may now submit a representation to the Principal Chief Commissioner of Income Tax/Commissioner of Income Tax of their regions, citing AIBSNLREA letter and the reply received, attaching copies of both our letter and the reply from IT department, by Speed Post. 22.12.2025: AIBSNLREA AGAIN WRITES TO SECRETARY, DPE POINTING OUT INACCURACY IN CALCULATION OF IDA RATE W.E.F.01.10.2025:

Contesting the reply from DPE that "as per the past practice of calculating IDA rates, average AICPI is rounded off to a single decimal (ignoring the subsequent digits)", AIBSNLREA has again written to the Secretary, DPE, pointing out that in the past DPE has rounded off the Average AICPI to two decimal places and there is no revision in the methodology. AIBSNLREA has requested his intervention to review calculation of IDA rate w.e.f. 01.10.2025, in light of the methodology recorded in DPE's earlier note sheet and to issue revised order reflecting the correct IDA rate of 233.3% instead of 233.2% w.e.f. 01.10.2025. 31.12.2025: CBDT RESPONDS TO AIBSNLREA LETTER DATED 10.11.2025 REQUESTING ISSUE OF A COMMON ORDER BASED ON ITAT CHANDIGARH ORDER DATED 30.05.2025 REGARDING INCOME TAX EXEMPTION ON EX-GRATIA RECEIVED BY BSNL VRS 2019 RETIREES:

Responding to AIBSNLREA letter dated 10.11.2025 requesting to issue a common order based on ITAT Chandigarh order dated 30.05.2025, CBDT has stated that "petitioner has not filed the grievance regarding its own case. The grievance filed by the petitioner relates to policy decision and issues relating to policy decisions do not fall under the definition of a grievance. After several letters from AIBSNLREA receiving same response from Lucknow BA, perseverance on our part is showing signs of resolution. Citing a Lucknow BA letter stating, "The case is presently under process for compliance and further action will be taken shortly, in accordance with the directions received", DoT has written to CGM UP East Circle, "to expedite the

24.12.2025: CGCA RESPONDS TO AIBSNLREA LETTER DATED 27.11.2025 REQUESTING IMPLEMENTATION OF SMS ALERTS FOR BSNL ABSORBED PENSIONERS ON DLC SUBMISSION THROUGH JEEVAN PRAMAAN:

In response to AIBSNLREA letter dated 27.11.2025 addressed to CGCA drawing attention to DoP&PW OM vide No. 1(3)2022-P&PW(H) dated 20.02.2024 and F.No. 1(2)/2023-P&PW(H) dated 13.01.2025, mandating PDAs to send SMS messages on the same day to ensure continuity of pension and to enable corrective action by pensioners in case of rejection, CGCA has stated that "It is submitted that under the enhanced system of SAMPANN 2.0, a comprehensive alert mechanism has been introduced to ensure timely and targeted dissemination of information to stakeholders. Various alerting tools such as dashboards, system notifications, SMS alerts, emails, and pop-up messages have been implemented. Under this enhanced system, SMS alerts are already being sent to pensioners, including BSNL absorbed pensioners, upon acceptance of their Digital Life Certificate (DLC). However, with regard to sending SMS alerts in cases of rejection or non-updation of DLC after stoppage of pension, it is submitted that this functionality is currently under process. At present, SAMPANN sends SMS alerts automatically to the mobile number registered in its database. In contrast, the Jeevan Pramaan portal allows pensioners to submit their DLC using any mobile number at the time of submission, which may differ from the mobile number registered in SAMPANN. Accordingly, in SAMPANN 2.0, necessary enhancements and system-level improvements are being carried out to enable SMS alerts to be sent to the same mobile number that was used for submitting the DLC on the Jeevan Pramaan portal. This will help ensure accurate and effective communication with pensioners. The said enhancement is presently under development." [View the CGCA reply](#)
